This issue highlights some significant issues in Research, Learning and Teaching activities for the School.

The 4th International Conference on Steel and Composite Structures was held from 21 to 23 July 2010 at the Sydney Powerhouse Museum and was sponsored by the School of Engineering Civionics Research Centre. The event attracted over 150 people including leading researchers, engineers, manufacturers, product providers, fabricators and contractors.

An International Workshop on Steel & Composite Structures was held at the University of Western Sydney and was hosted by the Civionics Research Centre in August. This workshop was the result of researchers from UK and China visiting our Centre after the ICSCS'10 conference held in Sydney in July. There were eight papers presented at the Workshop on Steel and Composite Structures at the University of Western Sydney (UWS) on 20 August 2010. This workshop was the result of researchers from UK and China visiting our Centre after the ICSCS'10 conference held in Sydney in July and also hosted by the Civionics Research Centre. Based on the existing research collaboration, we believe that this workshop will be a catalyst for further collaboration in steel and composite structures research between researchers at UWS and those from the UK and China.

Greenhouse Precinct

Jon Allen hosted two Dutch greenhouse experts on 19 August who gave a presentation to Engineering staff.



Jon also visited a large-scale greenhouse in Adelaide and met with researchers at the University of Adelaide's Plant Accelerator together with the Dutch visitors i.e., Prof. Bill Bellotti and Dr. Leigh Sheppard, as part of an on-going project to establish a greenhouse precinct at Hawkesbury campus.
