Exchange to Taiwan in Spring 2010 (August to December)

UWS has secured three (3) scholarships from the Commonwealth valued at \$5500 each to study in Taiwan in Spring 2010 (starting August and going until December)¹.

Notes on costs:

- 1. Students currently receiving benefits through Centrelink should remain eligible for these while on a UWS exchange program. Contact Centrelink to confirm individual eligibility.
- 2.UWS arranges and pays for your health and travel insurance while you are on exchange, saving about \$1000.
- 3. Yuan Ze University expects total living expenses to be approximately \$300 Australian dollars per month.

Yuan Ze University

Deadlines are short! Apply now.

Students must apply by 19 March 2010.

Scholarships are awarded once a student has met the criteria for exchange program participation and the scholarship. In the case of the scholarships to Taiwan for Spring 2010, there are three (3) scholarships available of \$5500 each. Where there are more than three (3) students who meet the criteria and apply by 19 March, UWS will use GPA as the determining factor to award scholarships.
