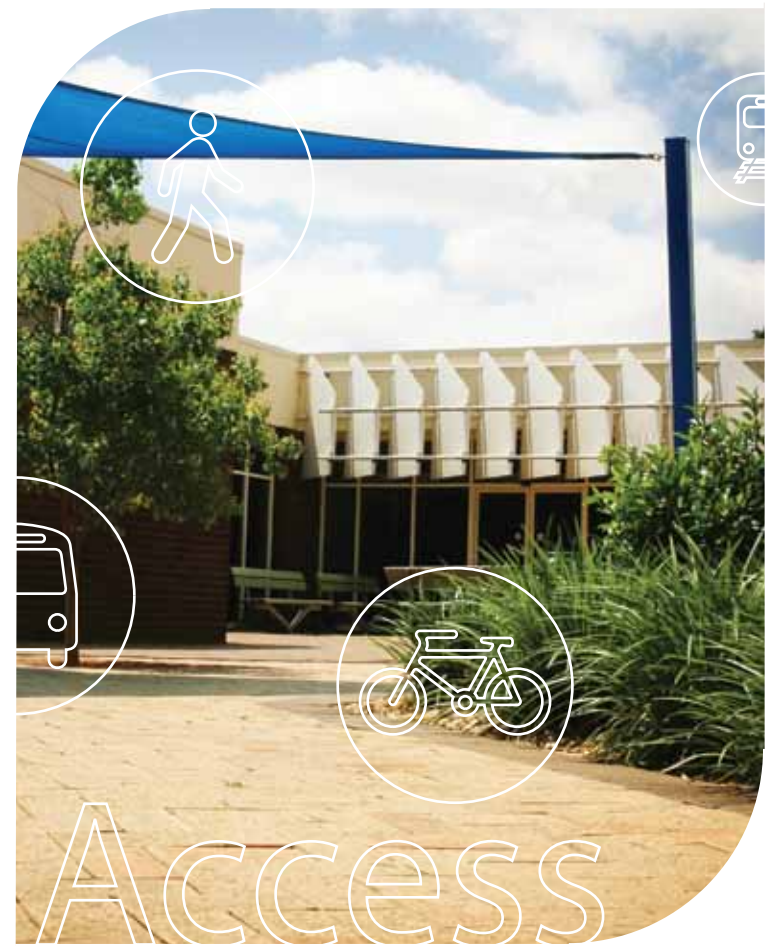

Getting to and from UWS Blacktown campus



The walk from Quakers Hill train station to the campus is approximately a 10 minute walk. Exit the station via Railway Parade then turn left onto Douglas Road. Cross at the main intersection at Quakers Hill Parkway and head towards the campus which is on Eastern Road.



City Rail Stations with bus services to the Blacktown campus include:

Quakers Hill Station is serviced by the Western Line with trains running every 30 minutes (approximately). The station is approximately 1km from the campus and will take a 10-15 minute walk or 5 minute bus trip on Busways 751 service.



Busways Service 745 leaves St Marys train station at stand 2 and stops inside the campus grounds.

Busways Service 752 leaves Blacktown Station at stand 4 approximately every hour and stops at the entrance to the campus.

Busways Service 751 leaves Quakers Hill Station at Lalor Road (opposite the Quakers Hill Police Station) and stops on Quakers Hill Parkway (cnr. Eastern Road opposite Reef Street) with a 5 minute walk to the campus grounds.



Cycling options include Quakers Hill Parkway to Doonside Crescent and the Westlink M7 which provides off-road shared paths for walking and cycling. Visit the UWS website at www.uws.edu.au/campus to download the local cycling map.

Showers are available for staff in Building U2. The University is continuing to improve its

cycling facilities. Thinking about cycling to campus? Need more confidence? Register for cycling proficiency skills training at transportaccess@uws.edu.au.

The Westlink M7 shared pedestrian and cyclist path is approximately 40km long between Camden Valley Way at Prestons and Old Windsor Road at Glenwood. It is an off-road four metre wide path separated from the motorway traffic. Stop numbers 48 and 49 at Quakers Hill are the closest to the Blacktown campus. Bicycle parking is available on campus outside the Library and buildings U2, U22 and T5.



Busways Service 745 offers wheelchair accessible services at limited times. Please consult the Busways timetable and look for the accessible symbol for these services.

Quakers Hill train station is wheelchair accessible. Specific station details can be found on the CityRail website www.cityrail.com.au or contact Transport Info.



Entrance to the campus is on Eastern Road, which is off the Quakers Hill Parkway. The closest motorway is the Westlink M7. Please refer to the UWS Interactive Map available at www.uws.edu.au/campus for directions and travel time.
