

Scholarship Categories

The University of Western Sydney undergraduate scholarships can be offered for study in any UWS course, or for study in specific colleges, courses or campuses. They can be divided into broad categories based on how applicants are selected: on academic merit or equity grounds, or a combination of both.

Group A: UWS Funded Scholarships		
Leadership and Academic Scholarships	The University of Western Sydney is committed to providing students with a contemporary learning environment. To further this aim, the University has introduced a number of scholarship opportunities based on a combination of academic achievement and leadership qualities.	
2. Opportunity Scholarships	The University of Western Sydney is committed to providing a number of scholarship opportunities to support access for talented students from equity and educationally disadvantaged backgrounds. Please note: All Group A UWS Funded Scholarships require the scholarship recipient to either reside in and/or have undertaken their Higher School Certificate or International Baccalaureate within Greater Western Sydney, as defined by UWS. (see GWS Postcode Section on page 37)	
3. Indigenous Scholarships	The University of Western Sydney aims to encourage academically gifted Australian Indigenous students who are either commencing or continuing their tertiary education at UWS.	

Group B: Donor Funded Scholarships

The University annually awards donor funded scholarships, providing support for students based on both academic achievement and equity considerations. This funding is made possible through the generous support of our donors, who may be an alumnus, business, individual, Council or other organisation with an interest in UWS.

Admission

To put yourself in the running, you should complete the Vice-Chancellor's Leadership Scholarship and Future Leaders Aspire at the University of Western Sydney™ Application Form available in this guide or online at myfuture.uws.edu. au/scholarships. Applications close 14 January 2011. Shortlisted applicants will be invited to attend an interview during late January.

Admission is on the basis of ATAR (minimum 90) or equivalent, together with your leadership experience and potential, non-academic achievements such as community involvement, and your motivation to be an ambassador for the University of Western Sydney.

To be eligible you need to be an Australian Citizen or Permanent Resident of Australia and be entering your first year of undergraduate studies.

Vice-Chancellor's Leadership Scholarships

Eligibility	Current high school leavers only*
Course(s)	Any UWS undergraduate degree
Description	The UWS Vice-Chancellor's Leadership Scholarships aim to reward the success and accomplishments of high-achieving secondary school students who demonstrate excellence not only in their academic studies, but also in some other aspects of their lives. Additionally, these scholarship holders are offered access to the Aspire Program which helps to optimise their academic and leadership potential.
Benefits	\$10,000 per year (or part-time equivalent)
Duration	Up to five years full-time (or part-time equivalent) for an undergraduate degree including Honours, or for a five-year combined degree.
Criteria	Applicants must: » be an Australian citizen or permanent resident of Australia » reside in or have undertaken their Higher School Certificate in Greater Western Sydney – see eligible postcode listing on page 37. » have applied for a UWS course as their first preference with UAC by close of Change of Preferences – 6 January 2011 » demonstrate a high level of academic achievement through a minimum ATAR 90 or equivalent » provide evidence of leadership and community involvement (e.g. School Captain, community service, sport, the arts, public speaking, Maths/Science Olympiads, Duke of Edinburgh award, etc). Due to the competitive nature of UWS Scholarships, any regional, subject and other bonus points are not taken into consideration for this scholarship.
Application and Selection Process	You must ensure that you complete the personal statement section of the application which requires you to demonstrate your leadership qualities and community involvement. Selection of this scholarship will be determined on the basis of ATAR results, personal statements and interview performance. If you are short-listed you will be required to attend an interview and must ensure your availability to do so.
Notes	* Students who are considering a gap year should apply in the year that they undertake their Higher School Certificate, and if successful, defer their UWS course and scholarship for up to one year.



Benefits	\$5,000 per year (or part-time equivalent)
Duration	Up to four years full-time (or part-time equivalent) for an undergraduate degree which may include Honours.
Criteria	Applicants must: » be an Australian citizen or permanent resident of Australia » reside in or have undertaken their Higher School Certificate in Greater Western Sydney as defined by UWS (see eligible postcode listing on page 37) » have applied for a UWS Advanced or Dean's Scholars degree as their first preference with UAC by close of Change of Preferences – 6 January 2011 » demonstrate a high level of academic achievement through a minimum ATAR 90 or equivalent OR » be currently enrolled in a UWS Advanced or Dean's Scholars degree and have maintained a GPA of 5 (credit average) in the previous year OR » have been accepted to transfer into one of the above listed UWS Advanced or Dean's Scholars degrees and have maintained a GPA of 5 (credit average) in the previous year.
Application and Selection Process	There is no application required. Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of highest ATAR and/or highest GPA to the maximum number awardable. The number of Dean's Scholarships available varies from year to year and they are offered at the discretion of the Executive Dean of the College.

Benefits	\$5,000 per year (or part-time equivalent)
Duration	Up to four years full-time (or part-time equivalent) for an undergraduate degree which may include Honours.
Criteria	Applicants must: » be an Australian citizen or permanent resident of Australia » reside in or have undertaken their Higher School Certificate in Greater Western Sydney as defined by UWS (see eligible postcode listing on p 37) » have applied for a UWS undergraduate course as their first preference with UAC by close of Change of Preferences – 6 January 2011 » demonstrate a high level of academic achievement through a minimum ATAR 90 or equivalent. Due to the competitive nature of UWS Scholarships, any regional, subject and other bonus points are not taken into consideration for this scholarship.
Application and Selection Process	There is no application required for this scholarship. Selection of these scholarships will be undertaken on the basis of highest ATAR, to the maximum number of scholarships available. A course quota applies.



Description	The UWS College of Business Academic Excellence Scholarship has been developed to assist undergraduate students within the College of Business to devote more time to their studies, allowing them to take full advantage of the College's strategic links with key professional and industry groups, and to give students the best possible chance of succeeding in their careers.
Benefits	\$5,000 per year (or part-time equivalent)
Duration	Up to four years full-time (or part-time equivalent) for an undergraduate degree which may include Honours.
Criteria	Applicants must: » be an Australian citizen or permanent resident of Australia » reside in or have undertaken their Higher School Certificate in Greater Western Sydney as defined by UWS (see eligible postcode listing on p 37) » have applied for an eligible UWS College of Business course as their first preference with UAC by close of Change of Preferences – 6 January 2011 » demonstrate a high level of academic achievement through a minimum ATAR of 90 or equivalent.
Application and Selection Process	There is no application required for this scholarship. Selection of these scholarships will be undertaken on the basis of highest ATAR, to the maximum number of scholarships available. The number of Scholarships available varies from year to year, and Scholarships are offered at the discretion of the Executive Dean of the College.

Description	The UWS Opportunity Scholarships aim to assist individuals in the Greater Western Sydney region who face economic, social or other disadvantage which makes university participation very difficult.
Benefits	\$5,000 per year (or part-time equivalent)
Duration	Up to four years full-time (or part-time equivalent) for an undergraduate degree which may include Honours.
Criteria	Applicants must: » be an Australian citizen or permanent resident of Australia » reside in or have undertaken their Higher School Certificate in Greater Western Sydney as defined by UWS (see eligible postcode listing on p 37) » demonstrate academic potential through a minimum ATAR of 80 or equivalent » be able to demonstrate financial or other hardship (see Equity and Opportunity Definitions section, p 35) » be applying for any UWS undergraduate degree OR » be currently enrolled in a full-time or part-time undergraduate degree at UWS; and » have maintained a minimum GPA of 5 (credit average) in the previous year. Non-current school leaver applicants will be considered on the basis of work experience and educational qualifications.
Application and Selection Process	Selection of this scholarship is based primarily on financial need and academic performance, to the maximum number of scholarships available. Additional factors such as educational disadvantage, membership of a specific equity group and/or significantly adverse personal circumstances will be taken into consideration.

Indigenous Achievement Scholarships

Eligibility	New students
Course(s)	Any UWS undergraduate degree
Description	The UWS Indigenous Achievement Scholarships aim to encourage academically gifted Australian Indigenous students who are either commencing or continuing their tertiary education at UWS.
Benefits	\$5,000 per year (or part-time equivalent)
Duration	Up to five years (or part-time equivalent) for an undergraduate degree which may include Honours.
Criteria	Applicants must: » be an identified Australian Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander » have achieved an ATAR of 65 or above, or equivalent* » be a high school leaver enrolling at UWS for the first time OR » be currently enrolled in a UWS undergraduate degree and have maintained a minimum GPA of 4 (pass average) » be able to demonstrate financial hardship (see Equity and Opportunity Definitions section, p 35).
Application and Selection Process	Selection of this scholarship is based on a combination of academic performance and financial need to the maximum number of scholarships available.

UWS Sports Scholarships

Eligibility	New and continuing students
Course(s)	Any UWS undergraduate or postgraduate degree
Description	Through uwsconnect, the University of Western Sydney offers sports scholarships to students either entering or continuing an undergraduate or postgraduate course. UWS is a member of the Australian Sports Commission's Elite Athlete Friendly University (EAFU) Network. This Elite Athlete support program is aimed at providing support to athletes to balance their sporting and academic commitments while at UWS.
	Scholarship recipients will receive financial assistance and have access to modern fitness facilities, academic counselling, personal development seminars, academic support and liaison, networking links and other opportunities.
Benefits	Up to \$2,000
Duration	One-off payment
Criteria	Applicants must: » be an Australian citizen or permanent resident of Australia » be applying for any UWS undergraduate or postgraduate degree » be an athlete competing at a state or national (school, age and/or open) championship level who is recognised by the relevant national sporting body as elite or in possession of development potential.





UWS Opportunity and Equity Definitions and Criteria

UWS Opportunity Scholarships recognise that all people have different needs and that some groups experience disadvantages that impact on their educational progress.

Opportunity scholarships are awarded to students who come from one or more of UWS's defined equity or personal disadvantage groups: people of Australian Indigenous descent, people from rural and isolated areas, people experiencing low socio-economic circumstances, people with a disability or long-term medical condition, people from a non-English speaking background and people experiencing longterm family difficulties.

People of Australian Indigenous descent

This category is for applicants who are Indigenous Australians, and who identify as an Indigenous Australian and are accepted as such by an Indigenous Australian community.

People from rural and isolated areas

This category is for applicants who live or have lived in a rural or isolated area. You should refer to the Australian Standard Geographic Classification (ASGC) remoteness areas classification list to determine whether you live (or have lived) in a rural or isolated area. Rural classifications are based

The classifications are:

- » Maior Cities
- » Inner Regional
- » Outer Regional
- » Remote
- » Very Remote

Applicants must live or have lived in any of these areas except the Major Cities and Inner Regional categories to be considered as living or having lived in a rural or isolated area.

People experiencing financial hardship circumstances

This category is for applicants who experience and can demonstrate low socioeconomic circumstances. You will be required to be:

- » in continuous receipt of a Centrelink payment i.e.: Austudy, Abstudy or Youth Allowance
- » in receipt of a pension
- or allowance under the Social Security Act 1991 or Veterans' Entitlements Act 1986 or Abstudy OR

» able to demonstrate exceptional financial hardship. if you are not in receipt of any Centrelink payments or benefits. (You must provide documented evidence.)

People with a disability or long-term medical condition

This category is for those applicants who can demonstrate that they have a disability, impairment or long-term medical condition. You will be required to submit a confidential statement of support which must be completed by a responsible person such as a doctor, lawyer, accountant, social worker, counsellor, religious leader or community leader. For current Year 12 students this also includes school/ college principal, school counsellor, year level coordinator or careers advisor.

Persons providing these statements must explain how the circumstances experienced have affected the applicant's educational performance. Persons providing these statements must not be related to the applicant.

People from a non-English speaking background

This category is for those who were born outside Australia in a non-English speaking country, and who arrived in Australia after 1 January 1998.

Long-term difficult family circumstances

This category is for applicants who have experienced difficult family circumstances on a long-term basis which have significantly disadvantaged their education over an extended

period. You will be required to submit a confidential statement of support which must be completed by a responsible person such as a school principal, doctor, lawyer, accountant, social worker, counsellor, religious leader or community leader.

Persons providing these statements must not be related to the applicant.

Some examples of long-term difficult family circumstances are:

- » homelessness
- » refugee status
- » long-term illness of a family member
- » applicant having carer responsibilities (children, parent, siblings, etc) or excessive responsibilities in the home
- » violence, abuse, alcohol/ drug, criminal proceedings/ issues in the family
- » disrupted schooling, e.g. attended three or more different schools, or moved interstate during Year 12
- » missed long periods of Year 12 for other than medical reasons, or commenced schooling in Australia at the beginning of Year 12
- » death of immediate family member or close friend
- » crowded living conditions
- » work requirements to support family
- » personal chronic illness
- » divorce/separation of parents.

How to Apply

Scholarship applications require some preparation, so ensure you familiarise yourself with the criteria and requirements, and dedicate enough time to complete the application form and obtain all the supporting documents.

It is important to take the application process seriously and to put in the extra effort, as this can make all the difference when the University is making its selections.

The personal statement especially requires you to think about your life goals, achievements and ambitions, and asks you to present your strengths.

The University of Western Sydney offers three categories of scholarships:

- Group A UWS Funded Scholarships
- Group B (Donor) Funded Scholarships
- Group C Commonwealth Scholarships apply via Universities Admissions Centre (www.uac.edu.au and follow prompts for equity scholarships)

Do not use this form for Group A UWS Funded, Group C Commonwealth Scholarships, Opportunity (Equity) Scholarships or International Exchange.

This is not an application for admission to UWS. Information relating to admission requirements and how to apply can be found at myfuture.uws.edu.au

A student may only hold 1 scholarship in each group; and hold a maximum of 2 scholarships in the period covered by the scholarships.

Certification of Documentation.

The person who certifies your document/s must be contactable by telephone during normal working hours. This person may be:

- An authorised officer at:
 - any Student Centre of the University of Western Sydney
 - any other university or TAFE College
 - the official records department of the institution that originally issued the documents
 - an Australian overseas diplomatic mission and Australian Educational Centres
 - the Universities Admissions Centre
- A Justice of the Peace with a registration number
- An accountant must be a member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia, or the Australian Association of Taxation and Management Accountants or be a Registered Tax Agent
- · A bank manager, but not a manager of a bank travel centre
- A credit union branch manager
- · A commissioner for declarations
- A barrister, solicitor or patent attorney
- A police officer in charge of a police station, or of the rank of sergeant and above
- A postal manager
- A Principal of an Australian secondary college, high school or primary school

You cannot certify your own documents, even if you belong to one of the categories listed above.

How should the authorised officer certify each document?

The Certifying Officer must print "I certify this to be a true copy of the document shown and reported to me as the original." on the document, as well as their name, address, contact telephone number, profession or occupation or organisation, the date and then sign the document.

The Certifying Officer should also include the official stamp or seal of the certifier's organisation on the copy, if the organisation has such a stamp.

In addition to the above, a Justice of the Peace must also print their registration number and provide details of the state in which they are registered.

Copies certified by a Justice of the Peace without a registration number will NOT be accepted. To find a Justice of the Peace in your area, check the public register of JPs available online from the NSW Attorney-General's Department at www.lawlink.nsw.gov.au.
